To be eligible for the 2012 Youth Olympic Games, athletes must have been born between 1 January 1995 and 31 December 1996. Athletes must also obtain the required FIS points, as stated in section B below.

B. Qualification System

PERFORMANCE & CONTINENTAL REPRESENTATION	
B.1	The top seven (7) nations in the overall standings of Marc Hodler Trophy standings at the FIS Junior Alpine World Ski Championships 2011 and the host nation are entitled to a quota of two (2) men and two (2) women, totally eight (8) nations.
B.2	The following nations scoring points in the men's and/or women's standings in Marc Hodler Trophy standings are entitled to one (1) starting place of each gender, until the maximum quota of 60 men and 55 women is filled.
B.3	Any remaining places will be distributed with a maximum of one (1) male and/or female athlete per nation, amongst the nations not yet qualified according to B.1 and B.2 and applying for a quota place. The quota allocation for these places will be determined by the YOG FIS points quota allocation list in consideration of international representation throughout all FIS disciplines on the programme of the Youth Olympic Games. The FIS points quota allocation list contains the best placed FIS junior male and female per nation in each event on the YOG programme (super-g, super combined, giant slalom, slalom).
B.4	The selection of athletes is at the discretion of each NOC, subject to the following performance criteria: - for slalom and giant slalom, FIS points in any FIS alpine event - for super g, FIS points in downhill, super g or giant slalom
B.5	Athletes are selected by their NOC to participate in all events, there may be no exchange of team

	member(s).
B.6.	The parallel team event will be composed of two (2) men and (2) women.
B.7	In the event of cancellation of the FIS Junior Alpine World Ski Championships 2011, the quota calculation in B.1 and B.2 will be carried out according to the FIS points quota allocation list.

HOST COUNTRY REPRESENTATION	
The host nation is entitled to a quota of two (2) men and two (2) women. The selection of athletes is at the discretion of the host NOC and subject to the above performance criteria. If the host nation is ranked in the top seven nations, then the eighth (8 th) nation in the Marc Hodler Trophy standings is qualified.

B. 1	The top seven (7) nations in the Marc Hodler Trophy standings for Cross-Country Skiing at the FIS Junior Nordic World Ski Championships 2011 and the host nation are entitled to a quota of two (2) men and two (2) women, totally eight (8) nations.
B.2	The following nations scoring points in the men's and/or women's standings in the Marc Hodler Trophy standings for Cross-Country Skiing are entitled to one (1) starting place of each gender, until the maximum quota of 50 men and 40 women is filled.
B.3	Any remaining places will be distributed with a maximum of one (1) male and/or female athlete per nation, amongst the nations not yet qualified according to B.1 and B.2 and applying for a quota place. The quota allocation for these places will be determined by the YOG FIS points quota allocation list in consideration of international representation throughout all FIS disciplines on the programme of the Youth Olympic Games. The FIS points quota allocation list contains the best ranked FIS junior male and female per nation in distance and sprint.
B.4	The selection of athletes is at the discretion of each NOC, subject to the athlete being registered and having FIS points.
B.5	Athletes are selected by their NOC to participate in both events, there may be no exchange of team member(s).
B.6	Each team participating in the Cross-Country Biathlon team relay will be composed of one (1) male and (1) female cross-country skier and one (1) male and (1) female biathlete.

B.7 In the event of cancellation of the FIS Junior Nordic World Ski Championships in Cross-Country 2011, the quota calculation in B.1 and B.2 will be carried out according to the FIS points quota allocation list.

HOST COUNTRY REPRESENTATION

The host nation is entitled to a quota of two (2) men and two (2) women. The selection of athletes is at the discretion of the host NOC and subject to the above performance criteria. If the host nation is ranked in the top seven nations, then the eighth (8th) nation in the Marc Hodler Trophy standings is qualified.

B. Qualification System

PERFORMANCE & CONTINENTAL REPRESENTATION	
B.1	The top twelve (12) nations in the men's and women's ski cross FIS points list of junior athletes are entitled to a quota of one (1) athlete in the respective event.
B.2	The top eight (8) nations in the men's and women's ski halfpipe FIS points list of junior athletes are entitled to a quota of one (1) athlete in the respective event.
B.3	The five (5) remaining places each for men and women per event will be distributed with a maximum of one (1) male or female athlete per nation, amongst the nations not yet qualified according to B.1 or B.2 and applying for a quota place. The quota allocation for these places will be determined by the FIS points list of junior athletes in ski halfpipe or ski cross respectively, in consideration of international representation throughout all FIS disciplines on the programme of the Youth Olympic Games.
B.4	The selection of athletes is at the discretion of each NOC, subject to the athlete having FIS points in the respective event, ski halfpipe or ski cross.
B.5	<u>Additional participation for athletes already qualified</u> – since the NOC quota for Freestyle Skiing is restricted to 1 athlete per gender per event, the following additional participation is allowed:

- B.5.1 Ski Cross - Up to one additional athlete per nation, already entered by the NOC in Alpine Skiing or Freestyle ski halfpipe, may also participate in ski cross subject to B.4, the athlete having FIS points in ski cross.
- B.5.2 Ski halfpipe - Up to one additional athlete per nation, already entered by the NOC in Freestyle ski cross or Snowboard halfpipe or slopestyle, may also participate in ski halfpipe subject to B.4, the athlete having FIS points in ski halfpipe.

HOST COUNTRY REPRESENTATION

The host nation is entitled to a quota of one (1) male and one (1) female athlete in ski cross and ski halfpipe. In the event that the host nation is not qualified in the top twelve (ski cross) or top eight (ski halfpipe) nations, then the host nation quota will be taken from the remaining five (5) quota places to be distributed.

C. Reallocation of unused quota places

REALLOCATION PROCEDURE

Any allocated quota places that are not confirmed by the respective NOC from the top twelve (ski cross) or top eight (ski halfpipe) nations, will be reallocated to the next ranked nations - ski cross: thirteenth (13th) fourteenth (14th), etc. – ski halfpipe: ninth (9th), tenth (10th), etc.

Any distributed quota places that are not confirmed by the respective NOC will be reallocated to NOCs applying for a quota place by FIS, based on the FIS points lists of junior athletes in ski halfpipe or ski cross respectively in consultation with the IOC, in consideration of international representation throughout all FIS disciplines on the programme of the Youth Olympic Games.

B.3	In the event that there are remaining places thereafter, the allocation for these places will be determined by the results of the Nordic Combined NH/5 km individual event at the FIS Junior Nordic World Ski Championships 2011, and thereafter the junior standings of the Nordic Combined Continental Cup 2010/2011, in consideration of international representation throughout all FIS disciplines on the programme of the Youth Olympic Games, to NOCs not yet qualified according to B.1 and B.2 and applying for a quota place.

B.2	Any remaining places up to a maximum of 25 men and 20 women will be distributed with a maximum of one (1) athlete per nation to the next ranked nations in the Ski Jumping individual event at the FIS Junior Nordic World Ski Championships 2011.
B.3	In the event that there are remaining places thereafter, the allocation for these places will be determined by results of the Ski Jumping individual men's and women's events at the FIS Junior Nordic World Ski Championships 2011, and thereafter the men's and women's junior standings of the Ski Jumping Continental Cup 2010/2011, in consideration of international representation throughout all Skiing disciplines on the programme of the Youth Olympic Games, to NOCs not yet qualified according to B.1 and B.2 and applying for a quota place.
B.4	The selection of athletes is at the discretion of each NOC, subject to the athlete being registered and having participated in a FIS-level or Continental Cup competition.
B.5	Each team for the mixed team competition will be composed of one (1) male ski jumper, one (1) female ski jumper and one (1) Nordic Combined athlete.
B.6	In the event of cancellation of the FIS Junior Nordic World Ski Championships in Ski Jumping 2011, the quota calculation in B.1, B.2 and B.3 will be carried out according to the Continental Cup standings 2010/2011.

B.6	In the event of cancellation of the FIS Junior Snowboard World Championships 2011, the quota calculation in B.1, B.2 and B.3 will be carried out according to the respective FIS points list of junior athletes in Snowboard halfpipe or slopestyle respectively.
