# Inuvik Skiers

## Show How

A whirlwind all the way from Inuvik has Port Arthur, Ont., reeling.

Ninety-five skiers from across the country are gathered for the four-day junior Dominion skiing championships but 10 of them—five boys and five girls from Inuvik—have frozen the others out of contention in the cross-country events.

In Thursday's opening events, they took the first five places in the women's five kilometre cross-country race—and that's all the entrants they had.

And 16-year-old Fred Kelly, known around Inuvik as the "Kelly Express" scored his 16th win in 18 races this season by

covering the 10-kilometre men's cross-country distance in 43:32, 19 seconds faster than second place finisher Malcom Hunter of Quebec.

Roseanne Allen, 13, of Inuvik, won the women's event in 26 minutes seven seconds, 26 seconds ahead of team-mate Shirley Firth.

Other Inuvik female entries finishing third, fourth and fifth respectively were Sharon Firth, 26:33; Janet Tourangeau, 27:27; and Anita Allen, 27:54. Finishing sixth was Jackie Crawford from Northern Ontario in 28:56.

The Western unit also took the third, fourth and fifth positions in the men's cross-country. Ed Day was third in 44:06, followed by Dave Evensen, 46:00, and Harold Cook, 46:07.

The cross-country races were held at Centennial Park at Port Arthur.

The Alpine events are scheduled to start today.

EIGHT OTHER NORTHERN SKI TEAM MEMBERS ALSO PLACED VERY HIGH IN THE COMPETITION THEY ARE ROGER ALLEN, AKLAVIK, HAROLD COOK, FORT GOOD HOPE, MAURICE LENNIN, FORT NORMAN, JOHN TURO, FORT GOOD HOPE, ANITA ALLEN OF AKLAVIK, SHARON FIRTH OF INUVIK, JANET TOURANGEAU OF NORMAN WELLS

FRED KELLY IS A STUDENT AT THE SIR ALEXANDER MACKENZIE SCHOOL IN INUVIK HE IS NICK-NAMED THE 'KELLY EXPRESS' AND IS KNOWN AS THE FASTEST SKIER IN THE NORTH LAST YEAR HE D PLACED SIXTH IN THE CANADIAN JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS THIS YEAR HE HAS WON 15 OF THE 17 RACES HE ENTERED
